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## Roundtable Title: Tutoring in a Writing Centre in Hong Kong

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## Abstract

A writing tutor's role has always been both challenging and exciting: challenging as the writer tutor is expected to be able to answer every possible question; and exciting as the writing tutor witnesses progress in students' writing. What can be done during a writing tutorial?

This Roundtable will discuss challenges the writing tutors face; share good practices and successful techniques; and consider strategies to tutor students from different learning cultures.

The following questions may be raised during the discussion:

- 1. What problems do the writing tutors face?
- 2. What techniques have they found most helpful?
- 3. What are the strategies when "quick fixes" are expected?
- 4. How to give students a sense of achievement after one, two or a few tutorials?
- 5. How to respond to expectations from different educational backgrounds, such as those of local and mainland students?
- 6. What role a Writing Centre supervisor plays?
- 7. How is seeing an advanced writing student different?
- 8. What support or assistance is needed in order to make the tutoring more effective?
