Establish an email response policy

Regular Weeks

- Announced in class and on Blackboard
- M-F 08:30 18:30
- Holiday(s) = Next workday response

Assessment Weeks

- Reg hours
- Sat 09:30 12:30 if deadline on Sun
- Reiterate policy in class
- Post reminder announcements

Benefits

- Fewer late-night emails
- Clear boundary
- Respectful communication
- Realistic expectations
- Less anxiety

Issues

- Consistent enforcement
- Receptiveness from students
- Resistance to compulsive email checking

Time's Up!

Get students to use a shared doc during breakout sessions













Step 1

- Show the instruction to on a slide.

Step 2

- Share your screen with the shared document.

Step 3

- Assign role and colour to each member in a team.

Step 4

- Share the document link in the chat room.

- Ask students to open the document on their browser.

Step 5

- Activate the breakout rooms.

Step 6

- Monitor students' progress on the shared document.

- Give instant help on the group chat on online class platform/ comment box on the shared doc

Use discussion forums and journals Time's Up! Blackboard

Discussion Forums

- Useful for group writing task after lesson
- All students can view each other's work
- Student can reply to the same thread within the group anytime

DISCUSSIONS → **CREATE FORUM**

Journals

- Useful for practice task submission
- Will not clutter your mailbox
- Privacy only you and student have access and can comment under same thread
- Blackboard can show new entries after last visit

TOOLS → **JOURNALS** → **CREATE JOURNAL**
